Dates of Camp: June 24th - 28th

Place: Stoneridge Baptist Camp, Smithville, AR

Cost: \$140 per person

Ages: Completed 3rd grade—Completed 12th grade

Check in at Stoneridge Camp will be Monday, June 24th from 12:00pm -3:00pm. Please do not arrive before 12:00. First meal will be served at 5:00pm. Check out will follow the morning closing ceremony on Friday.

Registration

This year, registration will be online and in paper form. Our registration link is lrrbaptist.org/camp/ The link will also be posted to the LRRBA Facebook page and website. Registration will open May 1st, nothing will be accepted until that time. A paper form will also be emailed, that can be printed off. Forms will also be available for pick up at the LRRBA office. It is up to individual churches to provide campers with permission slips for their parents to sign according to church policy. Paper forms should be returned to the Association Office no later than June 13th.

- Churches should call in an estimated camper total by June 1st. The final deadline for camper registration is June 13th.

Payment

Churches are responsible for collecting camp fees for each camper. Church leader will bring one check made payable to LRRBA to the registration table at camp on Monday, June 24th. Please include Church Camp on the memo line.

Dorms and Color Team Assignment

Dorm assignments will be made starting June 1st after we receive estimations of the number of campers and chaperones. Most groups will share a dorm room with at least one other church, depending on numbers. Every effort will be made to space everyone comfortably. Dorm cabins are air conditioned and include shower facilities.

Chaperones

We encourage every church bringing campers to enlist qualified volunteers who have experience working with children/youth. In addition, churches will need to provide a written copy of a background check (current within the year) for each chaperone. Enclosed in this packet is one copy of the Chaperone/Adult Volunteer Handbook. Each chaperone must receive a copy, read it, and agree to abide by the policies provided in the handbook. Things to Bring

- ✓ Bedding (pillow, blankets, twin sheet, etc..)
- ✓ Towels (one for showering and one for the pool)
Toiletries (toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, shampoo, soap, etc..)
- ✓ Refillable water bottle, (**your name needs to be on it in permanent marker or vinyl**)
- ✓ Clothing for 5 days, including clothing that can be worn while playing outdoor games, swim suit, and clothes for services (See camp rules for dress code)
- ✓ Appropriate shoes (no flip-flops worn during recreation)
Bible
- ✓ Money for the concession stand (most snacks and drinks are \$2)

2023 Church Camp Rules & Regulations

Program

- A. Be **present, prompt, properly** dressed, and attentive for all activities
- B. Campers will attend all scheduled meetings unless special permission has been granted by chaperone.

Housekeeping

- A. Dorms will be kept **CLEAN** and left **CLEAN** at the end of the week. (Church should consider bringing a few cleaning supplies)
- B. Personal belongings and bunks will be kept orderly
- C. Camp grounds will be kept clean and free of trash at all times.

Dress Code

- A. Everyone will look neat and smell nice during morning and evening sessions.
- B. Shorts may be worn to services. **No SHORT shorts, halter tops, or midriff shirts worn at camp.** No leggings, unless worn under a dress or long shirt. No pajamas worn except at bedtime.
- C. Swim cover-ups or towels will be worn to and from the pool area. No two-piece swim suits will be allowed.
- D. No clothing with questionable pictures or writing.

Conduct

- A. Everyone is expected to conduct themselves in keeping with the Christian spirit.
- B. Bullying of any kind will not be tolerated.
- C. Those in charge will be respected. Campers will be expected to cooperate with instructions. Chaperones and adult leaders will make every effort to be fair. Camp Director has the final word on all decisions. Materials that could be a distraction to the assembly or that will cause friction between campers or damage to property will not be permitted.
- D. **No electronics. Cell phone use during scheduled activities will not be permitted.** Stoneridge camp, churches, or adult chaperones cannot be held responsible for lost, stolen, or broken cell phones. Cell phones may be used in special circumstances WITH chaperone permission.
- E. Use of tobacco/vaping products will not be permitted (Campers & adults)

Grounds

- A. No one shall leave the assembly grounds without permission from the Camp Director.
- B. The swimming area is off limits outside of designated swim time and to all who are not swimming.
- C. The area around the girls' dorm is off limits to boys and the area around the boys' dorm is off limits to girls.
- D. The cafeteria is off limits except during meal times.
- E. No one will be permitted inside cabins during free time without adult supervision.

These rules are made in order that church camp will be an enjoyable experience for everyone. Campers not complying with rules will be sent home.
